



EAGLE WATCH TEAM CAPTAIN RULES

• Captains must refer to the General Tennis Rules, the League Play Rules and the Non-Resident Rules and Guidelines for more clarification and information. All rules must be conveyed to each team member.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Team captains and co-captains must both be Eagle Watch property owners and members in good standing with the Eagle Watch Homeowners' Association.
- It is necessary to check with the Tennis Director before starting a new team.
- Eagle Watch league teams attempting to fill team vacancies should coordinate their efforts with the Tennis Director.
- Team captains must permit a tennis pro staff member online access to their league rosters and schedules by making him/her their DESIGNEE. Failure to do so may result in no court assignments for home matches at the Eagle Watch tennis facility.
- Practice time includes team lessons and is scheduled through the Tennis Director. Teams have 3 hours of available practice time that may be divided into 1-hour minimum sessions at a captain's request.
- Each team captain should check with the Tennis Director to make sure his or her team has courts for home matches.
- Each team gets 2 courts for home matches. No team may sign up for a 3rd court.
- If you experience a rain makeup situation, you should notify the Tennis Director before rescheduling your matches to ensure 2 courts are available.

TEAM COMPOSITION

- A minimum of 2 residents to every 10 non-resident team members will be required. Exceptions do occur. Check with the Tennis Director and Tennis Committee if you are considering an appeal prior to submission of rosters to the appropriate league. The appeal process starts with the Tennis Committee and ends with a final decision by the Eagle Watch HOA Board of Directors. This takes time so plan accordingly.
- Each team member is guaranteed to play 2 times each season. A resident complaint could result in loss of team tennis privileges at the Eagle Watch facility until the complaint is rectified to the satisfaction of all parties.
- A returning team is defined as one that comprises at least 50% returning members from the previous season. This team will have a reserved spot for the next season if they notify the Tennis Director. If a team sits out the next season, that spot will become available for a new team on the waiting list.
